I especially want to thank Mr. Horace Kadoorie in giving me a start with the Shanghai Gas Co., Ltd., and also his kindness in visiting me from time to time when I had the misfortune in being hospitalized for ten months. I had an accident which occurred on the 17th July 1945 and again on the 27th July 1946. For a boss to come to the bedside of an ordinary employee during those long months was something which I shall always remember gratefully.

I take the opportunity to express my appreciation and thanks to Dr. Honan Dschu, the famous bone surgeon of the Eden Hospital for his

successful operation or my left knee which was shattered by bomb splinters. The job was so well performed that I have regained the use of my limb.

I also want to thank Dr. Arthur Mendel, the famous nerve specialist of 108 Rte. Pichon for his excellent job in restoring me from a concussion of the skull after my jeep accident.

Million and ore thanks to the American-Jewish Joint Distribution Committee, Far Eastern Office and their local Director, Mr. Charles H. Jordar for his kind assistance enabling me to enter the United States of America.

Thanks to the United States of America and their Leaders for this human attitude and as a consequence I will do all my best to honor this country and hope to be after a couple of years, a real citizen of the United States.

Nine years have passed...nine years full of good and bad days, but through the kind assistance of the Chinese Government, we the refugees and I have been permitted to settle down since 1939, after our flight from the Nazi-purge.

Let me take this opportunity to express my heartfelt thanks to the Chinese People and their Government for their help.
