Marjorie Bray (née Bottomley) 's father was a civil servant and volunteer during the Second World War in Hong Kong. She spent the war years in the United Kingdom but moved back to Hong Kong in 1948. Bray later married District Officer Denis Bray, who went on to become the Secretary of Home Affairs.
