



CATER, Lady Peggy

Lady Peggy Cater (née Richards) was born in London, United Kingdom and moved to South Africa to work for the BBC before marrying Sir Jack Cater in 1950. Sir Jack was highly involved in the formation of the ICAC and later became the Chief Secretary of Hong Kong in 1978. The couple spent most of their lives together in Hong Kong before moving to Guernsey on the Channel Islands in 2001.
