



## **CORREA, Frank**

Born in Shanghai in 1931, Frank Correa moved to Hong Kong at the age of two, where he received his education at La Salle College. Correa spent most of the war years staying at his grandfather's house in Kowloon, which served as a safe haven for many members of the Portuguese community. Correa joined China Light (CLP) in 1953 working at the audit department. He moved to Australia in 1967.

Narrates his education at La Salle and the Portuguese community's livelihoods during the Second World War in Hong Kong.
