Nora Krouk was born in Harbin, China to a Jewish mother and Russian father. The family later moved to Mukden (now Shenyang) and Shanghai, and finally Hong Kong before immigrating to Australia in the 1970s.

Nora's son Anthony Krouk was born in China, and left for Israel, Hong Kong then Australia in the 1970s.
