

LEWIN, Werner

Werner Lewin was born in 1921 in Potsdam, Germany to a wealthy family. In 1938, during Kristallnacht, he and his brother were saved by the heavy weight champion boxer Max Schmeling. The Lewins fled to Shanghai and remained there during the war years till their immigration to San Francisco in 1946. The Lewins became successful hoteliers, and partnered closely with the Hilton Hotels group.
