



PULLINGER, Jackie

Jackie Pullinger graduated from the Royal College of Music in the United Kingdom at the age of 20 and ventured out to the Far East to become a missionary. Pullinger arrived in Hong Kong in 1966 by boat and worked as a primary school teacher in the Kowloon Walled City, which was notorious for its crime rates and opium dens. Pullinger later established a youth club to help drug addicts and started a charity called the St. Stephen's Society which provided rehabilitation homes for youths.
