



WESTPHAL, Frederick

Fred Westphal was Chairman of Peninsula Electric Power Company, which was the first company formed under the joint venture established by China Light (CLP) and Standard Oil (ExxonMobil) in the early 1960s. Westphal retired in the early 1970s and was residing in the United States at the time of the interview.
